Math:

In math we have been working on multiplication and estimation quite a bit for the last couple of weeks. We are now beginning to work on division and will be for the next two weeks. Please continue to encourage your child to complete their homework which they receive every day but Friday. We go through the homework every single day to make sure students understand what they did right and wrong, and they have an opportunity to ask any questions they need to ask.



Language Arts:

This week students took their first Wonders test. This was broken into three parts and given on separate days to make it more manageable. Students also created structure maps to help them write their first essay writing.

<u>Spelling</u>: Spelling words will be sent home at the beginning of each week. Students are expected to write the words twice on the front side and fill in the word meaning side as well. The papers are due back to school on Thursday of each week. There was no spelling this week.
