

Math:

In math we have been working with division of fractions as of late. We continue to review fractions and decimals that we have worked on earlier this year but also have been learning how fractions and decimals can sometimes be used interchangeably. We will be working on fractions and decimals for another week and a half before taking a test. Then we will be moving on to area, volume, and geometry.



Language Arts:

We have been reading about how groups and individuals need to work together towards a common goal. This week students have been reading about the dolphin, Winter, who was rescued after being entangled with rope. She lived at an
