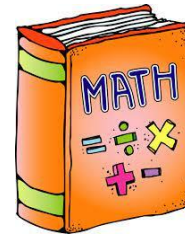

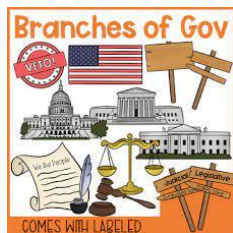
**Spelling:** Spelling lists go home on Monday. Students need to complete both
