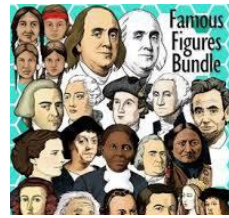

Iris Mickelson and Gage Arnold earned ties this past week.

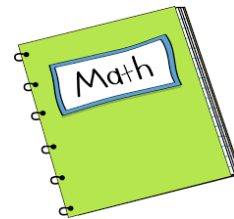

Math:

In math we are still working on coordinate grids as well as reviewing many concepts we previously studied earlier in the year, attempting to make sure what we learned earlier in the year is engrained into their memory. In the days ahead we will be working with line graphs and using geometry on coordinate grids.



Language Arts:
