It is crazy to me that we have already completed week 4! WOW!! Has that ever gone quickly. Enjoy the fall weather, I think it is here to stay.

Writing/Reading

The last few weeks in reading, we were reading about natural disasters. It was quite an informative couple of weeks, learning about earthquakes, volcanoes, hurricanes, tsunamis, etc. We had fabulous discussions!

On Wednesday this week, we began our unit on Realistic Fiction. We talked about characteristics that make up Realistic Fiction, such as: characters, a story being made up but one that could happen in real life, the problem/solution within the story, and turning points. I connect the books I read aloud to the kids, to our genre studies. This makes the lessons much more authentic.

We have also begun drafting our personal narratives. Students are writing about an event that happened in his/her life, writing the event from the beginning, middle and end perspective, and including sensory details. I am really driving home the importance of communicating clearly through text and writing complete sentences. I am excited to see what they create!

I began spelling and grammar work this week. The first spelling test was today (check your child's daily papers for scores). We have been discussing subjects and predicates, compound sentences and the long /a/ patterns in words.

I also am expecting kids to read for 30 minutes each night. It can be broken up throughout the day, but please try to have your child read 15 minutes aloud to you and then 15 independently.

This will help improve your child's stamina and will help expand his/her vocabulary and knowledge base and fluency.

Math

We will finish up our Place Value unit next week and will test. I am planning to have a review day next Wednesday, and a test on Thursday. We will be covering all place value concepts; rounding, naming place values, expanded form, written form, standard form, addition and subtraction with regrouping. Any help that you can give your child with problems like these is greatly appreciated!

Please be sure that your child is doing his/her math homework every night. This will really help in the long run because your child is getting two opportunities each day to solidify the concept that was taught that day. It also keeps you informed as to what is being taught in the classroom. If you have questions about Math, please reach out. I know that it can be tricky figuring out exactly what the questions are asking.

Another request is that you begin to work with your child to master his/her multiplication facts. We will become heavily dependent on "knowing" them so that your child does not have to work as hard when we get to the multiplication unit in early October. Having the facts memorized will help free up thinking about how to solve a multi-digit multiplication problem. We can focus on process not fact figuring AND process.

Thank you in advance, your child and I thank you. I am really trying to avoid many tears and frustration on your child's part (and maybe yours too) later!
