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## What's happening in 4th Grade!

<u>Math:</u> We are at the end of Mission 5 in math! We just took our unit test on today (Friday) and the students did great! The students have been working hard learning about fractions (how to add and subtract them with alike and unlike numerators and denominators!) On Monday, we will be starting a unit dealing with decimals. I do remind them of any homework they may have every day, so please be aware.

<u>Science</u>: We have switched back over from Social Studies to Science. The students did a great job completing and understanding our country's regions.
